#### **PASTOR'S CORNER**

The month of August is named in honor of the first Roman emperor, Octavian, who was given the title of "Augustus" or "The Revered One" by the Roman Senate. While this appellation may seem conveniently flattering, the Senate was reflecting the commonly held view that Octavian was indeed worthy of the greatest respect.

Now before we join the rush to acclaim the emperor, let's remember that by virtue of his office he was a dictator, despot, and autocrat. In other words, he was a man above contradiction or opposition. The fact that he tried to rule with a view to the welfare of his people - a rarity among absolute rulers - garnered him the title of "Revered One" that we now use for the pleasant month of August.

But since Americans do not have a king, many of us instinctively view a single man rule with a jaundiced eye. Yet, as Christians we profess ultimate allegiance to Jesus Christ, the King of Kings and Lord of Lords. How then can we reconcile our wariness of human government with that of our Lord and His kingdom?

The answer is found in two sayings. For humanity it is essential to remember that "Absolute power corrupts absolutely." And as for the Lord Jesus we are encouraged to remember that "Seeing the people, He felt compassion for them, because they were distressed and dispirited like sheep without a shepherd" Matthew 9:36.

Thank God for the compassion that is found in King Jesus! We can unreservedly revere Him knowing that he cares for our best interests. May you find that to be a living reality in your life during the month of August.

#### **Looking a Bit Wilted**

I have an ever-expanding container garden on the deck. After one long weekend away from my potted plants, I returned home to find that some of them looked a little droopy. It hadn't rained for a few days, and the watering can apparently hadn't made it's rounds while we were gone.

The plants perked right up after they got some water, and I totally get what that feels like.

One hot day recently, I felt just as parched as my poor, neglected plants. We were roaming the grounds of the Drake well in Titusville, and I hadn't brought any water with me. I plopped myself down on a shady bench and was mentally going through my hydration options.

To my surprise, a little girl came up to me and asked me if I was thirsty. I said that I was and then realized that she was cradling three bottles of cold water in her arms. She gave me one and assured me that it wasn't poisoned (which Damon says is just what a little girl passing out poisoned water would say, but I'm doing okay).

Her mother, who was watching this scene unfold, told me that the daughter thought I looked thirsty. I'm not sure what my equivalent of wilting leaves is, but apparently, I was giving off some signals. And was I ever grateful that she noticed.

That water was just what my body needed physically—but it was also a good spiritual reminder that God provides for us. As I sat there getting rehydrated and waiting for Damon, I thought about the prophet Elijah and the times that God sent him food by way of ravens or an angel. Accepting water from a little girl sounds commonplace in comparison, but my experience in Titusville still felt a bit on the miraculous side.

Of course, the next step in my reflections was to realize that it really doesn't take much to recognize someone's needs and do what you can. That little girl is a good model for us all—a model of how to show God's love to a thirsty world.

Beacon #7-Purchasing a New Organ

October 8, 1985 Minutes-Motion that the Session affirm the Choirs desire to obtain a new organ and any fund raising activities will be dealt with when presented to the Session.

November 26, 2985 Minutes-The Moderator will ask Russ Moon to meet with the Session in December to report on the organ fund.

December 17, 1985 Minutes-Motion to approve the selection of the Allen Organ Model 3100 and authorize the Organ Committee to negotiate a firm price at which time they will return to the Session for final approval of the purchase.

January 28, 1986 Minutes-Motion made, seconded, and passed for Congregational Meeting March 9 to obtain approval for purchase of Allen Organ when money is available for said purchase and for the cost of placement.

March 6, 1986 Minutes-Motion to approve Sketch #6 for the organ placement in the choir loft from previous location below the pulpit.

September 23, 1986 Minutes-Motion, seconded, and passed to schedule Organ Dedication for October 12, at 7:30 P.M. Mr. Walter Greenwood will be the organist for the recital. Fellowship hour will follow.

Motion, seconded, and passed for Session to provide choir \$100.00 towards cost of flowers and refreshments for dedication.

Stated Meeting, October 21, 1986 reported 325 persons attended the organ dedication and recital.

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
