PASTOR'S CORNER

October Beacon Article

October has a rather undeserved reputation as a "spooky" month. Perhaps the fact that Halloween is at the end of the month has something to do with this characterization. Still, we should not forget that the month of October abounds with traditions, rituals, and events that testify to, and celebrate the joyful side of life.

In Germany, the celebration of Oktoberfest has brightened the smiles – while dimming the wits – of multitudes for centuries. In the United States, festivals dedicated to the harvest time are very popular. When I lived in the Ozark mountains there was an annual apple butter festival where they had the unusual practice of allowing a person to sit in a trailer filled with apple shavings for ten minutes soaking up the flavored air. The aroma was intoxicating, and the cost was only one dollar – which was a donation to charity.

Speaking of apples, did you know that the Lord sees us as the "Apple of His Eyes"? This means He views us with favor and love. Psalm 17:8 says, "Keep me as the apple of your eye; hide me in the shadow of your wings, O Lord." When we come to see ourselves as the most cherished and beloved part of God's harvest on this earth then we will begin to realize that "Neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Romans 8:39)

May God's blessing be upon you this harvest season.

Always Know the Way Home

One fall day when I was growing up, our Gordon setter, Katie, and I were chasing grouse from one grape vine thicket to another in the woods behind our house. I wasn't paying much attention to where I was, just following the flight of the bird and the dog that was on its scent.

Suddenly, though, I realized that I had no idea where I was. Nothing looked familiar. I was disoriented, not even sure which direction home might be in.

Fortunately, those woods weren't massive. I got myself out of that fix by walking a straight line until I came across a landmark that I recognized. But it was a sobering experience, and from that point on, I made sure that I always kept track of the general direction we'd started from so that I could find my way back.

Similarly, we need to stay grounded as we navigate life. In the woods, I now always try to be aware of where home is. In life, the Trinity (God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit) is that fixed point we should be ever mindful of.

The Psalms are filled with language that harkens back to the idea of God as a guiding light, a rock, a shepherd, and a fortress. For example, Psalm 119:105 says that God's "word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." Psalm 25:4-5 asks God to: "Make me to know your ways, O LORD; teach me your paths. / Lead me in your truth and teach me, for you are the God of my salvation; for you I wait all day long." All these images emphasize our need to rely on God as we find our way.

To do that, we must be mindful of where we are in relation to Him and the model that Jesus gave us for a life in Him. As Hebrews 12:1-2 says, "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God."
